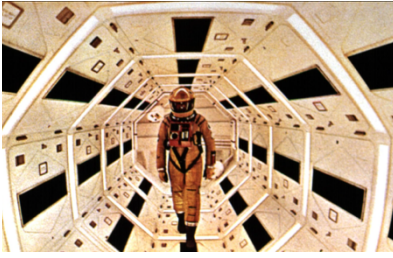
Free - Talking Art in Maine welcomes Artist Jane Dahmen

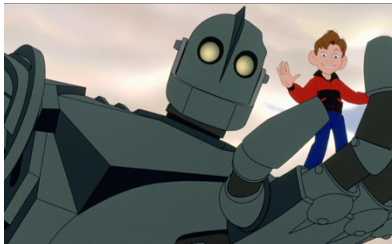
