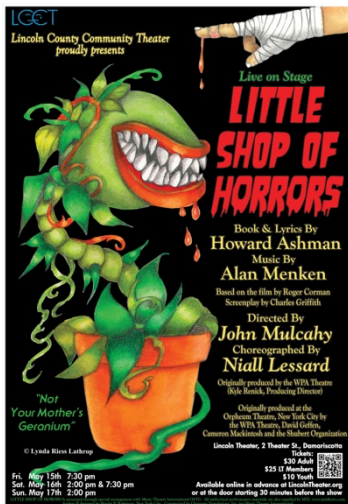
Silent Film with Live Accompaniment; The Black Pirate (1926; 1 hour, 24 minutes)
