

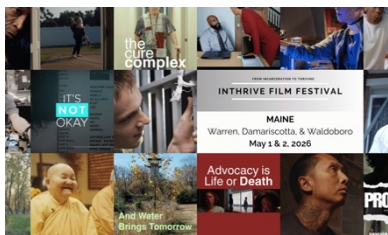

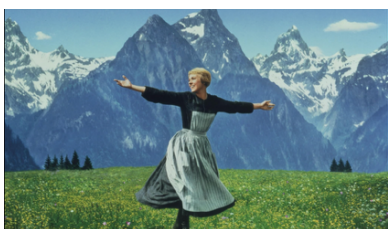
Met Live in HD: Eugene Onegin (Tchaikovsky; approx. 4 hours, 5 minutes – 2 Intermissions) with Pre-Opera Talk by Dr. Morton Achter

Soprano Asmik Grigorian returns to the Met as Tatiana, the lovestruck young heroine in this ardent operatic adaptation of Pushkin, transmitted live from the Metropolitan Opera stage. Knife: The Attempted Murder of Salman Rushdie (NR; 1 hour, 47 minutes)

30 years after Iran issued a religious decree calling for Salman Rushdie's death over *The Satanic Verses*, he traveled to Chautauqua to speak about the U.S. as a sanctuary for exiled writers and artists. There, a man rushed the stage to kill him with a knife. Alex Gibney's documentary is a testament to freedom of expression and a defiant response to the attempt on Rushdie's life.
