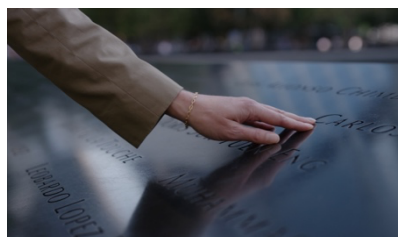
Women Laughing: An Evening with New Yorker Cartoonist Liza Donnelly

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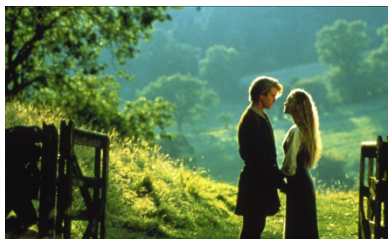
Free - Free Willy (PG; 1993; 1 hour, 51 minutes)
